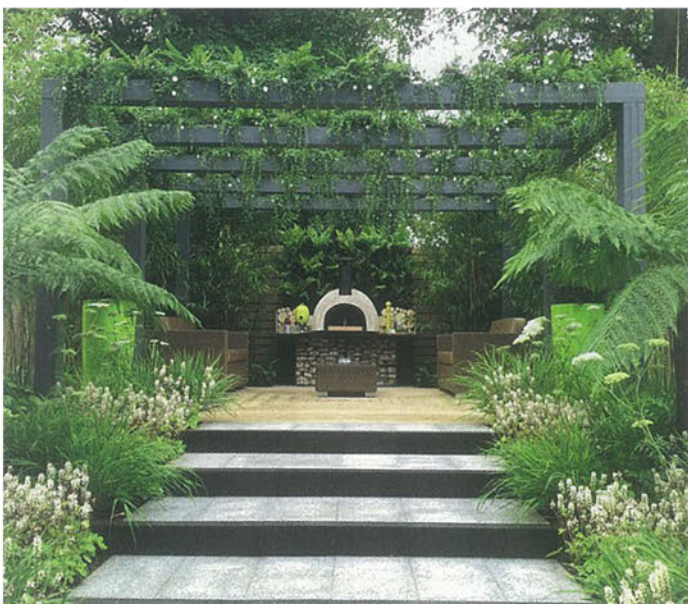
Look 1 SOCIABLE SPACE

- ✦ THE IDEA Just a couple of simple and inexpensive accessories such as this bright lantern and stool can add a splash of cheerful colour to an outside space. Plus they can easily be moved from inside to out. An awning provides weather protection when needed.
- ✦ GET THE LOOK Buy Vietnamese lanterns at Indochine, £40.50 for a large silk design with hanging clip and tassels. Stone stool in Red, £133, Kartell at Nest. Find awnings at Screwfix, from £199.99.



Look 2 ECLECTIC COURTYARD

- ✦ THE IDEA Using a vibrant colour as a backdrop is a great way to brighten a garden, particularly if the space is shady or has a gloomy corner. It can also help to create continuity between the outside space and your interior scheme.
- ✦ GET THE LOOK Gardens by Stuart Craine start at £20,000. Try Dulux Weathershield paint in Fuchsia Falls 2, £16.99 for 2.5l.



Look 3 FEATURE FIREPLACE

- ✦ THE IDEA This raised outdoor living area is surrounded by verdant foliage. In addition to regular beds, it features a living pergola that provides privacy and shade as well as offering extra space for planting, while the wood-fired oven is set in front of an on-trend living wall.
- ✦ GET THE LOOK This garden was designed and landscaped by Garden House Design for £18,000. Sofas and coffee table set, from £1,800, also by Garden House Design.



Look 4 TARGET PRACTICE

- ✦ THE IDEA Designed to create a flat playing field for three young boys to play football on, this garden is bordered by an abundance of lush, mixed foliage that adds depth and texture to the otherwise level plane. The hot, bright palette of orange, white and purple planting has been chosen so as to provide colour and scent all year round.
